- Demonstrate a working knowledge of the European and American environment of corporations, business, governmental affairs and multicultural issues;
- Integrate the knowledge acquired in the program in order to develop a critical understanding of the political, economic, environmental and social issues intertwined in current affairs, whether locally, regionally or internationally; and
- > Pursue postgraduate studies or professional qualifications in the field of International Relations.
